

AMAL/ADAL supply blocks consist of functionally packaged medical supplies and equipment which support Marine Corps units during a contingency or specific mission. The contents are based upon the "adequate but austere" deployable medical system concept. The blocks are intended to support the war fighter's mission and are not to be considered an extension of other medical facilities or units.

An AMAL/ADAL is an approved list of items maintained in a particular equipment or supply block. It is a list of the minimum items required to be maintained in a particular equipment or supply block. The AMAL/ADAL list serves as the basic source document to support supply management of these configured stocks.
